## 1998 Postal Stationery Commission meeting, Milan 30 October 1998.

#### Minutes.

The President of the Commission, Dr. Alan Huggins welcomed Delegates and Observers to the meeting.

#### 1. Roll call.

#### 2. Presentation from Professor Saverio Imperato.

The President introduced Professor Saverio Imperato and invited him to give a talk on the "Cavallini" issued by Sardinia in 1819.

An excellent presentation followed during which the original decree announcing the introduction of the "Cavallini" and examples of each issued type were shown. The speaker explained that the "Cavallini" stamp impression denoted the payment of a fee to the Government for permission to send or carry a letter, any charges for its actual carrige having to be paid in addition. Thus the "Cavallini" were technically stamped revenue paper rather than postal stationery. The 15 centisemi fee permitting a letter to be carried up to 15 miglia(37km), the 25 centisemi fee up to 35 miglia (86km) and the 50 centesimi over 35 miglia.

A lively discussion followed the presentation and the President conveyed the warm appreciation of those present to Professor Imperato.

### 3. Report to the 1998 FIP Congress.

The Report (previously circulated) from the Commission President to the 1998 FIP Congress was formally approved.

## 4. Proposed changes to FIP Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

Data on numbers and ages of acreddited postal stationery jurors was tabled together with numbers of qualified exhibits.

The following points were discussed:-

- a) Retirement age for FIP accredited jurors and maximum age limit for the acceptance of apprentice juror nominations.
- b) The consolidation of the FIP commissions.

The following consesus views emerged:-

- c) Each case should be considered objectively on its merits in terms of continuing competence as an accredited juror. Jury apprentices should ideally not be older then 60 years of age at the time of accrediation if they are potentially going to be able to serve at a number of exhibitions. Noted that age-related regulations are illegal in a number of countries.
- d) Agreed that there were a number of sound practical reasons for the continuance of the Postal Stationery Commission. These included:
  - i) The Commission is a direct line of communication between FIP and the collectors and exhibitors within the National Federations.
  - ii) The commission provides for the promotional, educational and training needs for collectors, exhibitors and jurors in respect of postal stationery
  - iii) The cost to FIP of the postal stationery commission is minimal.
  - iv) There are currently about 200 exhibits of postal stationery qualified at international level.
  - v) The Commission is a world-wide focal point for postal stationery matters.

#### 5. Progress report on current projects.

- a) Introductory Booklet:- completed sections had now been edited, other sections in preparation.
- b) Compilation of Information/Bibliography on Postal Stationery;- progress slow because of limited response from delegates. Noted that PLN International, Brandespad14, NL-3067 EB Rotterdam, Netherlands had privately published Postal Stationery Literature of the World (75pp. Cost \$US 5.00 DM 10.00 or NLG 10.00 in banknotes for surface mail or \$US 7.00 by air).
- c) Seminars:- Successful Commission Seminars were held at PACIFIC 97 and INDEPEX 97, and others have been given by Commission members at non-FIP events.

#### 6. National Federation Activities.

The following activities were noted:-

- a) AUSTRALIA Ed Druce, Commissioner General for AUSTRALIA 99 to be held in Melbourne from 19-24 March 1999 hoped as many Commission members as possible would attend as postal stationery was one of the major classes.
- b) FINLAND Kari Rahiala announced that NORDIA 2001 would take place in Tuscon, Arizona in January 2001 in conjunction with the ARIPEX US National Stamp Show.
- c) ITALY The new 1999 edition of the Pertile catalogue had just been published.
- d) NETHERLANDS B Hellebrekers reported that the Guesendam catalogue had been published and that the Netherlands Postal Administration no longer gave advance notice of the issue of postal stationery items.

#### 7. Future events.

The following Commission events are being planned:-

- a) AUSTRALIA general presentation on the historical background to the origins of postal stationery both generally and specifically to Australasia; arranged for the morning of Tuesday 23 March 1999 in the Exhibition Halls in Melbourne.
- b) PHILEXFRANCE 99 seminar on the evaluation of competitive postal stationery exhibits; for those wishing to to be apprentice Jurors attendance at such a seminar is part of the qualifying process; arranged for the morning of Sunday 11 July 1999.
- c) CHINA 99 general presentation on postal stationery; date to be arranged.
- d) The Stamp Show 2000 presentation on the origins, evolution and development of British postal stationery; date to be arranged.

#### 8. Date of next formal meeting of the Commission.

Noted that the next formal meeting of the Commissions would take place just before the FIP Congress to be held on 14 – 15 October 2000 in Madrid.
