
# Golden Age of Stationery

- New South Wales embossed envelopes and wrappers of 1838 and Mulready envelopes of 1840 were not a great success.
- Entering an Australia Post Shop in the 1990s postal stationery one could be forgiven for thinking that postal stationery had finally achieved the success which Rowland Hill first predicted and that we had indeed entered the 'golden age of postal stationery'.

# Experimentation


 In 1986, Australia Post began experimenting with a range of unconventional postal stationery, many of which bore no indication of value, being inscribed 'Postage Paid'.

# **Super Satchel**



 In 1986 Australia Post issued the 'Super Satchel' which prepaid the delivery of contents of any weight to any destination in Australia by airmail for a flat charge of \$1.50.

# Flat Rate Envelopes



- 1987 \$2.50 'Flat Rate' envelope
- launched with considerable fanfare with glossy advertising brochures and advertisements in the public press.
- originally sold only in packs of 20 although later packs of five were sold.

# Flat Rate Envelopes

#### Reprints

- flap at the right, Australian Bicentennial logo
- late 1987 printed 'air mail label' in dark blue, flap on the left
- 1988: instruction No 2 on the reverse now reads 'To avoid the envelope bursting during use, flat contents up to a maximum of 1 kg are recommended. Normal Postal Packing requirements apply. For advice ask at the Post Office.'
- 1988 Expo 88 logo.
- 1989 added instruction 'Documents or Business Papers only, Recommended maximum weight 1 kg', no bicentennial logo.
- 1989 self-adhesive flap.

# **National Park Envelopes**



- Postage Prepaid Envelopes now the standard for definitive stamped envelopes.
- National Park envelopes issued 30 October 1989. (\$1) Wilson's Promontory (C5), (\$2) Uluru (C4), (\$2.50) Fitzgerald River (B4), (50c) Cradle Mountain (DL), (50c) Millstream Falls (DL) (50c) Kosciusko (DL window)




#### **AIRPAK**




 The 'Airpak' was introduced on 2 October 1989. It was a plastic airmail satchel paying postage on 1 kg carried by airmail anywhere in Australia and sold for \$7.50.

#### **Parcel Labels**



 Australia Post experimented with a Tasmanian Christmas parcel label in 1987, prepaying parcels up to 10 kg from Tasmania to New South Wales and Victoria for \$7.

#### Parcel Labels: SANTAPAK



- Christmas 1988 Santapak parcel labels Issued 28 November 1988 prepaying parcels up to 10 kg surface mail and were sold with a *Postpak* box.
- Statepak (state of posting) \$7
- Aussiepak (within the eastern states and South Australia) \$9.50
- Aussiepak (for air mail within the eastern states and South Australia) \$19


### **Pre-paid Parcel Boxes**





- 1 November 1989 'Giftbox' prepaid surface mail parcel of up to 5 kg anywhere in Australia.
- 26 February 1990 Businessbox

# Pre-paid Parcel Boxes: Definitive Issue



- 1 October 1991 Pre-paid boxes.
- (\$3.50) prepaying up to 500g anywhere in Australia
- (\$5.50) prepaying up to 2 kg state of posting
- (\$7.50) prepaying up to 2 kg interstate
   (\$6.50) prepaying up to 5 kg state of posting
- (\$9.50) prepaying up to 5 kg interstate

#### **Parcel Post Satchels**





- Prepaid surface mail parcel post satchels were issued in August 1997.
- The satchels prepaid the surface parcel rate to anywhere in Australia. Two sizes were issued:



# Padded Envelopes: Talking Letters




 November 1987, Australia Post issued at a price of \$5.25 a pre-paid padded *Talking Letter Envelope* as part of a package including a cassette on which you were intended to record a message for friends or relatives. Initial trial in Brisbane and the Gold Coast; second issue being sold at Expo 88, Brisbane.

# Padded Envelopes: Definitive Issue



- November 1992 prepaid padded envelopes. surface mail anywhere in Australia for up to 500g.
- product code eg 41595
- Reprints different shade of red and with new product numbers on the reverse eg 599/0057).

# Padded Envelopes: International Airmail



- November 2002 Four international airmail padded bags:
- 500 g Asia Pacific (\$8), Worldwide (\$12)
- 2kg Asia Pacific (\$25), Worldwide (\$40)

#### **Courier Satchels**



Prepaid courier satchels 1992:


- (\$8.50) letterpack, green, 500g for delivery anywhere in Australia
- (\$12) multi-pack intrastate, up to 3 kg
- (\$21) multi-pack interstate, up to 3 kg
- (\$31) maxi pack to 5 kg

# Courier Satchels AP/Australian Air Express

- In 1993 Australia Post combined with Australian Air Express to provide a courier service. Australia Post sold three prepaid satchels:
- (\$8.50) letterpack,
   500g anywhere in Australia (\$10) multi-pack intrastate, up to 3 kg
   (\$15) multi-pack interstate, up to 3 kg


- In July 1997 the Australia Post/Australian Air Express courier satchels were redesignated "Signed courier satchels". \$8.50 500g satchel; \$12.50 3 kg satchel
- August 1999 reprint with customer service and web details.




# Cards With Printed Stamp Images

## Express Post Envelopes and Satchels

 1 October 1991 Express Post Envelopes and Satchels for guaranteed overnight delivery between the capital cities. Two envelopes C5 (229mm x 162 mm) envelope \$2.80 and a B4 envelope (353 mm x 250 mm) \$3.80.






